German Sociologist, Ulrich Beck's risk society theory suggests there is a movement away from traditional social institutions and industrial society, and towards a new society which is individual, global and selfconfrontational (reflexive). Environmental or Critical realism developed as an alternative approach which attempts to approach environmental issues in a scientific way (Giddens 2009). The hunter gathering tribes and the settled agriculture tribes totally depend on the forest for their livelihood and their way of life is no way harm the sustainability of the forest. If people's life is to be improved in an environment friendly way, it should be without being subject to the destructive way of harvesting. A majority of Non-Timber-Forest Products in forest is for medicinal uses. It is reported that forest berbs and leaves are the best medicines for immunity, fertility, abortion, asthma, jaundice, itching, etc.
